THE WAY FORWARD FOR BETHEL'S AV UPDATE

Bethel's Council is grateful for the AV Update Task Force's work and all the feedback received from the congregation. 80 households completed surveys, with the majority indicating support for moving forward with the full update now. Of those responses that expressed concerns, two general themes emerged: the operating budget deficit and screens in the sanctuary. Weighing this information, Council has prayerfully discerned our way forward. We moved to form an AV Update Fundraising Task Force, to be led by Catherine Engle. The update will be accomplished in three phases. 100% of the funds needed for each phase will be raised before Council signs that phase's contract.

Phase 1: Sanctuary Audio—\$65,550 Phase 2: Back of the House (i.e. Youth Room, Center Pod, CLC, and Narthex)—\$49,200 Phase 3: Sanctuary Video—\$67,500

The AV Update Fundraising Task Force will determine appropriate timeline goals and manage education about the project as it unfolds.



Dear Bethel,

It's delightful to be part of the ensemble in the Northfield Arts Guild's fall production of *My Fair Lady*, and I am enjoying singing about getting to the church on time. My favorite song from the show, however, is Eliza's "Show Me!" A young admirer tries to profess his love, but Eliza, frustrated by the artifice she's found in the world of the upper class, explodes: *Words! Words! Words! I'm so sick of words ... Don't talk of stars burning above; if you're in love, show me!* ... *Don't talk of fall! Don't talk at all! Show me!* I'm a big fan of words, but Eliza's plea echoes exhortations in scripture:

- 1 John 3:18: "Little children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth."
- James 2:15-17, more firmly: "If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead."
- Finally, a quote attributed to St. Francis: "Preach the gospel. If necessary, use words."We bless our pets this month, but they bless us in all the ways they show us love.

Who has shown you Christ's love recently? Was it in a latte or a hug, a shared activity, a task taken off your plate, a listening ear?

Thank you for all the ways I see you show Christ's love with a big heart in the congregation. Sometimes it is simply by your commitment to showing up for each other each Sunday at worship. Sometimes it is through the Good Samaritan Fund and the gas and food cards that help our neighbors. Sometimes it is in serving at fellowship or Bistro, or volunteering in Sunday School and confirmation classrooms. As you keep doing the things you've received or seen that have been meaningful to you yourself, may you know God's peace and joy.

It happened unexpectedly. It caught me utterly by surprise. I needed to grab a part off of a skid loader trailer and take it to the field. The trailer is over waist high so my plan was to run up one of the wheel ramps that was lowered to drive the skidder off. As I started up the incline, I realized I didn't have the balance required to go up the ramp. That had never happened before. So, I rolled onto the trailer somewhat like a beached whale and hoped no one noticed it on the shop camera. In that moment I experienced a little bit of what it feels like to get older. I was somewhat embarrassed and really never mentioned it to anyone. However, I knew things had changed.

For older adults, these kinds of changes can be concerning; both for the person involved and for their families. Sometimes it's awkward to bring up level of care issues that are becoming a reality for our loved ones. It's difficult to know how to start the conversation for both parties. A good conversation starts with a good question that leads to more good questions. These kinds of conversations require deep listening. Change can happen when we listen for feelings and emotions as well as words.

ENDOWMENT FUND ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS FOR 2025

The Bethel Endowment Committee is pleased to announce it will be accepting grant proposals for its 2025 Endowment distribution. The Committee will accept proposals starting September 15 and ending November 15.

- Applications are available at the East Welcome Station and on the Bethel website. • Please submit completed applications online or to the church office, attention Endowment Committee.
- The proposal should focus on one of the three Endowment designations Outreach Ministries, General Missions • of Bethel, or Education.

Winning proposals will be announced in January of 2025, and the award disbursements will be made early 2025, totaling \$15,000. As I follow the political campaigns, I realize one truth – money matters. Money equates to support. Money allows the parties to pay for campaign workers, TV time, and rallies. Money enables the message to be heard.

In many ways, Bethel is no different. Money, nicely referred to as offerings, allows Bethel to share the message. Offerings pay for skilled pastors and staff, a building where we come together, and a place for all to find comfort and acceptance.

Through August, we have received \$600,000. To meet our budget, we need an additional \$369,000 or \$92,000 per month, September through December. Can we do it? Absolutely. Last year, Bethel members donated \$375,000 in the same period. This is a race we can win.
