# **ANNUAL MEETING PREVIEW**

Tending to our organization each year helps ensure we act as a coordinated body of Christ. Martin Luther emphasized the importance of the good order of the church to ensure the proclamation of the gospel. Each January, as a congregation, we formally meet to consider everything from finances to the insights from committees and program staff.

#### January 19 — Budget Meeting

9:45 am in the Sanctuary

To allow for a careful review of our finances, we offer a Budget Meeting the week before the Annual Meeting. Our wonderful treasurer, Barb Fowler, will present the 2024 numbers and the proposed budget for 2025.

#### January 26 — Annual Meeting

As a congregation, we will receive 2024 reports and look together at the year ahead. Be physically present to vote on the 2025 budget, new council members, and to update the constitution!

#### The umbrella of Mission & Justice

There is energy and excitement as Mission & Justice has reimagined itself to enhance coordination and cohesiveness. In the new year, it will serve as an "umbrella" committee, and will draw its members from the leadership of our Creation Care, Reconciling In Christ (RIC), Homes for God's Children, and Anti-Racism Learning & Advocacy (ARLA) teams (as well as from potential new ministry teams that form around Hunger, Immigration, or Elder Care.)

#### The Constitution Update

A link to the electronic version is provided in the weekly email for your review, or if you prefer, hard copies are available at the welcome stations and the church office. Some of the update is simply language changes to align our verbiage with the ELCA and SEMN Synod requirements. (For instance, "Church Council" has been replaced by "congregation council" to match Synod wording.) Other changes recommended by Bethel's congregation council have a more significant impact, such as:

- Including a president-elect position on the congregation council. This person is intended to become the president after either 1 or 2 terms are served. This will give them a better understanding of Bethel's current work and allow for a smoother transition to being the council president.
- Shortening the terms of all council positions from 3 to 2 years. The hope is that this
  will make service on the congregation council more accessible. As before, a member of
  the congregational council may succeed oneself for up to 2 terms.

**BEFRIENDERS** by Marci Groenewold

Befriender Ministry training devotes an entire session to the topic of "Grief." Grief is a "normal response to a great loss." Some degree of loss happens to everyone every day due to circumstances oftentimes beyond their control. Since loss affects each person differently depending upon the type and severity, sometimes we need more support than what a friend, pastor, or BeFriender Minister can offer. The mixed emotions, time constraints and extended family concerns during and after the death of a loved one make bereavement a difficult human experience. Coming together, or retreating with others who are experiencing similar losses, can result in healing, relief, and comfort. Beginning Tuesday, January 14 and continuing every other week, Bethel is creating that space to come together.

A six-session extended retreat for anyone grieving the loss of a relative or friend

facilitated by spiritual director Barb Holm and Pastor Phil 2:00—3:30 pm @ Bethel January 14 & 28, February 11 & 25, and March 11 & 25

This support group will be a "closed group" after the second session. Those attending will come with the expectation they will be able to attend each session. Participants can expect to have their stories and concerns held in confidentiality. All judgments will be set aside. Each person's experience will be received with warmth, support and God's loving presence. The group size will be limited to 12 participants. The registration deadline is Friday, January 10. 

# IN THE LIBRARY...





## CAC Crisis Housing

The CAC has units it uses as emergency, short term housing for those who are suddenly homeless. When more permanent housing is found, the CAC invites the individuals to take some of the household items with them (linens, pillows, cleaning materials and the like) since they have absolutely nothing to stock their new housing with. To aid the CAC, the Homes for God's Children Committee has decided that the project for 2025 will be to obtain and restock some of the crisis units with these items as they turn over.

Please visit the display in the narthex if you would consider signing up to volunteer with the restocking. We will be notifying the congregation when the need for more materials arises as well as what materials are need or if we need financial support.
